

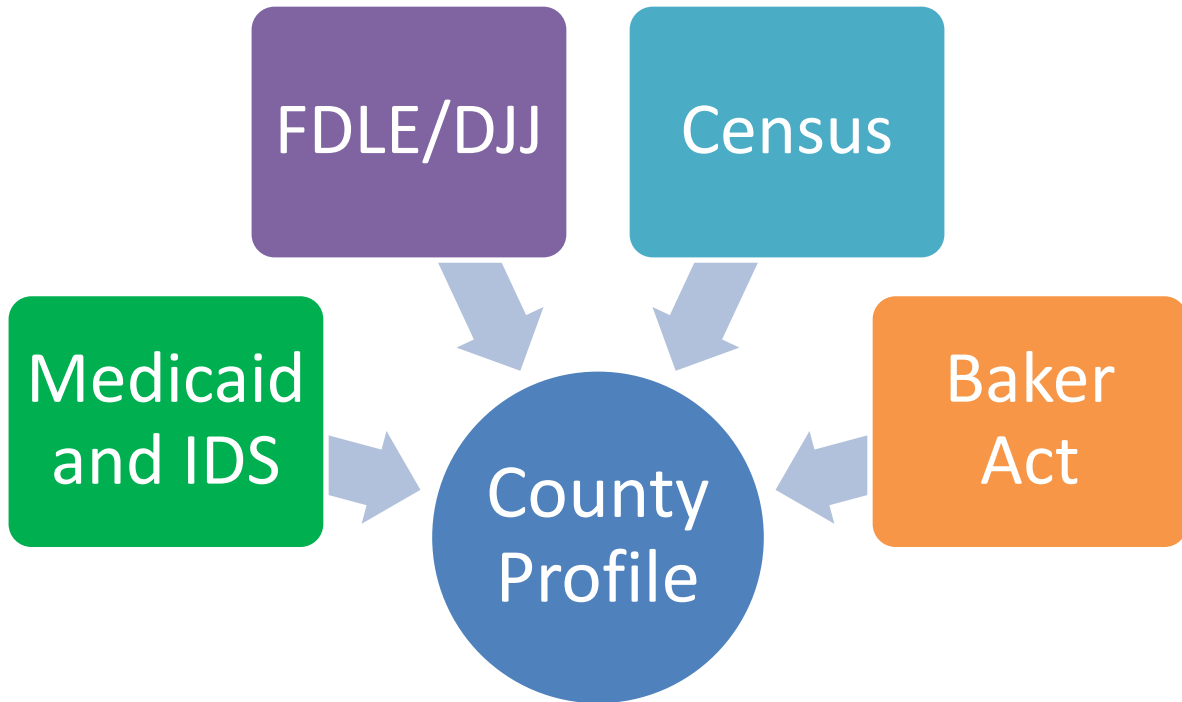

INTRODUCTION

The data displayed on this website and the corresponding PDF document is a compilation from various sources. Public record items are cited with a link to the source. Secure data housed within the Florida Mental Health Institute (FMHI) is also noted but additional access to the data must be arranged through the Technical Assistance Center.



Below is a description of each variable and technical notes regarding interpretation. Like the website, the data is presented in three tiers: County, Arrestee, and Arrestee with Severe Mental Illness (SMI).

AVAILABLE DATA

UTILIZATION OF MENTAL HEALTH, SUBSTANCE ABUSE AND/OR DUAL DIAGNOSIS SERVICES WITHIN COUNTY

The data below is generated by analysis of Medicaid and Mental Health and Substance Abuse Measurement Information Data System (SAMHIS) data from the year selected from the map. The original source is the Florida Agency for Health Care Administration (AHCA) and the Florida Department of Children and Families respectively. It is housed at the Policy and Services Research Data Center (PSRDC) at the Louis de la Parte Florida Mental Health Institute. As in previous sections race and ethnicity categories are not mutually exclusive therefore the total may not equal 100.

Terminology

- Service Utilization - Individuals who have at least one service contact with Medicaid and/or IDS during fiscal years 2001 to 2006 in the state of Florida.
- Year of Arrest – Refers to year selected when creating data sheet; if no year was selected then default is year listed under name of county in second column.
- Mental Health (MH) Services - Receipt of mental health service paid for by Medicaid and/or IDS. ICD-9 Diagnoses included are as follows:
 - Dementias
 - Alcohol-induced mental disorders
 - Drug-induced mental disorders
 - Transient mental disorders due to conditions classified elsewhere
 - Persistent mental disorders due to conditions classified elsewhere
 - Schizophrenic disorders
 - Episodic mood disorders
 - Delusional disorders
 - Other nonorganic psychoses
 - Pervasive developmental disorders
 - Anxiety, dissociative and somatoform disorders
 - Personality disorders
 - Sexual and gender identity disorders
 - Physiological malfunction arising from mental factors
 - Special symptoms or syndromes, not elsewhere classified
 - Acute reaction to stress
 - Adjustment reaction
 - Specific non-psychotic mental disorders due to brain damage
 - Depressive disorder, not elsewhere classified
 - Disturbance of conduct, not elsewhere classified
 - Disturbance of emotions specific to childhood and adolescence
 - Hyperkinetic syndrome of childhood
 - Specific delays in development

- Psychic factors associated with diseases classified elsewhere
 - Mild mental retardation
 - Other specified mental retardation
 - Unspecified mental retardation
- Substance Abuse (SA) Services - Receipt of substance abuse service paid for by Medicaid and/or IDS. Diagnoses included are as follows:
 - Alcohol dependence syndrome
 - Drug dependence
 - Nondependent abuse of drugs (excluding – tobacco used disorder)
 - Dual Diagnosis (DD) – At least on mental health service and diagnosis and at least one substance abuse service and diagnosis.
 - Severely Mentally Ill (SMI) –At least one mental health service and/or diagnosis of the following:
 - Schizophrenic
 - Episodic Mood
 - Delusional
 - Other nonorganic psychoses disorders

BAKER ACT WITHIN COUNTY

These figures are a product of cross referencing Baker Act data (Statewide 72 Hr Involuntary Psychiatric Evaluation) which contains statewide information on initiations, individuals, facilities, and behavior issues resulting in the Baker Act initiation with the AHCA and IDS data described above.

- Total Number of Baker Act Initiations - An initiation is the action taken by the law enforcement, judiciary, and/or mental health professional, which allows for the 72 hour involuntary psychiatric evaluation.
- Number of Individuals – This is often less then the number of initiations due to multiple initiations for the same individual.

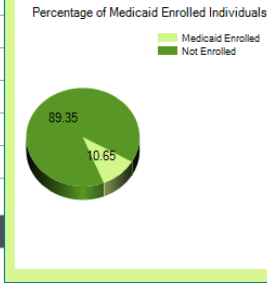
